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Tomorrow belongs to each of us. Let's imagine it together

Future Narratives is a transnational project involving youth organisations and stakeholders across Europe, co-funded by Erasmus+.

Our goal is to use narrative and Futures Literacy to engage, connect, and empower young people, enabling their voices and their vision to reach out to policy-makers, public administrations, civil society and other young people all over Europe.

Training and innovation

Our project began with a series of training events and webinars held with all partners. Our goals were to share our expertise and experiences, learn from guest speakers about the theory and practice of narrative, storytelling, and Futures Literacy, and develop innovative quidelines for the use of these concepts in work with young people.

Following session on narrative and Futures Literacy developed by Traces&Dreams, we enjoyed webinars from leading experts in the fields, including Riel Miller, UNESCO Head of Futures Literacy; Sohail Inayatullah, the inaugural UNESCO Chair in Future Studies; and Wendy Schultz, Director of Infinite Futures and a globally recognised futurist. These experts generously shared their knowledge to help us to deepen our understanding of Futures Literacy, narrative, and storytelling, and to learn more about how the concepts can be implemented in youth work. Key throughout was the idea that we can develop our ability to 'use the future' in ways that benefit us in the present.

Alongside the invaluable contributions of these experts, our partnership benefited greatly from the opportunity to share and build upon our existing wealth of knowledge. Our partners in Spain, Greece, Germany and Sweden possess decades of combined experience in working with young people in a range of contexts, from a variety of backgrounds, and many diverse methods and approaches.









These experiences are connected by some common

threads, most importantly the determination to place young people at the centre, to listen rather than to instruct, and to create spaces in which people can tell their own stories and imagine their own futures. Through our training together, all partners were able to contribute the knowledge gained through their own experience, and to reflect upon the ways in which new ideas could be implemented and new approaches developed.
